Admission Requirements

Graduates of an accredited high school with not less than 15 units exclusive of physical education will be admitted without condition if they rank in the upper half of their class. For students who have not finished their high school work, other evidence of qualification to do college work will be considered by the Admissions Committee. Individual consideration is given to veterans.

Students coming from another college must present transcript of credits and statement of honorable dismissal.

Admission Arrangements

Application should be made upon blanks secured from the Dean of Students, William Jewell College.

Graduation Requirements

Commencement is held at the end of the session for candidates for the degree of Bachelor of Arts. (See College catalog for requirements.)

Juition and Other Expense

Ten semester hours may be earned during the 10 week session.

The tuition for the ten weeks session is \$105. For less than 6 semester hours credit the cost is \$18 per semester hour.

Who Should Attend Summer School

The courses offered have been chosen with three groups of students in mind.

- 1. The student already in college who wishes to accelerate his program.
- 2. The high school graduate or other qualified student who wishes to enter upon his college work at once without the loss of any time, and to accomplish as much as possible before military duty may intervene.
- 3. The secondary or elementary teacher who wishes further work for certificate requirements or as credit for a degree. William Jewell offers an A.B. degree with a major in secondary or elementary education.
