Admission Requirements

Graduates of accredited high schools with not less than fifteen units exclusive of physical education will be admitted unconditionally provided they rank in the top half of their class. For students who have not completed high school work, other evidence of qualification to do academic work on the college level will be considered by the Admissions Committee. Individual consideration will be given to veterans.

Students transferring from other colleges are required to present an official transcript of credits and

a statement of honorable dismissal.

Graduation Requirements

Tuition and Other Expense

Eight semester hours may be earned during the 8 week session.

The tuition for the eight weeks session is \$95. For less than 6 semester hours credit the cost is \$18 per semester hour.

Who Should Attend Summer School

The program has been especially designed to assist students in College wishing to accelerate and the secondary or elementary school teacher completing work either for the Bachelor of Arts degree or for additional certificate requirements.
