

Admission Arrangements

Tuition and Other Expense

Credits are in semester hours. Eight semester hours may be earned during the 8 weeks session.

The tuition for the eight weeks session is \$100. For less than 6 semester hours credit the cost is \$18 per semester hour.

Rooms are available in Minetry Jones Hall for women. The cost for 8 weeks per person is \$55.00. The Snack-Bar will be open for the convenience of students. Room reservation may be made by writing the Dean of Students.

Who Should Attend Summer School

The program has been especially designed to assist students in College wishing to accelerate, and the secondary or elementary school teacher completing work either for the Bachelor of Arts degree or for additional certificate requirements.

The high school graduate or other qualified student desirous of beginning college work immediately and completing the requirements for graduation in the shortest possible time will find summer courses planned for his needs.

William Jewell College, founded in 1849, is known nationally as "the Campus of Achievement." This distinguished title acquired by the College is due to the high percentage of its graduates who have attained eminence and success in postions of responsibility and leadership. The College is coeducational and offers a four-year liberal arts program. The 106-acre campus is situated on a hill overlooking historic Liberty, Missouri, fourteen miles from downtown Kansas City.

Admission Requirements

Graduates of accredited high schools with not less than fifteen units exclusive of physical education will be admitted unconditionally provided they rank in the top half of their class. For students who have not completed high school work, other evidence of qualification to do academic work on the college level will be considered by the Admissions Committee. Individual consideration will be given to veterans.

Students transferring from other colleges are required to present an official transcript of credits and a statement of honorable dismissal.

Teachers' Certificates

Teachers' certificates are issued by the Superintendent of Public Instruction at Jefferson City upon receipt of the student's college record, which the Registrar will send at the student's request.
